- Emergency Public Health Proclamation lifted:
 - Content Area Tests passed prior to spring student teaching or starting program residency
 - Coursework started on or after May 12, 2023, and used towards licensure must be passed with at least a C- (or equivalent)
 - Short-term substitutes \$25 fee returns and can only teach for 5 consecutive days in single placement

- edTPA was set to restart in spring
 - As of August, two-year hold and working group to be convened to evaluate potential teacher performance assessments as replacement
 - Report due by August 1, 2024
 - □ Hold expires August 31, 2025
 - Individual institutions can still require the edTPA for program completion

- Approval of a task force to look into possible changes to professional educator licensure requirements
- ISBE required to develop:
 - Comprehensive literacy plan
 - Provide rubric to evaluate reading instruction programs
 - Provide training for teaching reading
 - Develop literacy subscore on (elementary) content area test

- Teaching candidates need to pass content area test for the content area <u>assigned</u> to teach or complete at least 9 semester hours of coursework prior to start date
- Chicago Public School District allowed to grant subsequent endorsements for a pilot program
- Allows substitute teachers to teach longer periods in emergency situations

- Extends issuance of 5-year short-term substitute licenses to 6/30/2028
- □ Until 6/30/2026 retired teachers can:
 - Teach for up to 120 days or 600 paid hours without effecting retirement status
 - Returns to 100 days or 500 paid hours after date

- Illinois Professional Teaching Standards (and the Social Emotional Learning Standards) update:
 - New Rules posted in Part 24, Section 140 of Rules
 - 5 standards: Learning Environment, Instruction, Instructional Assessment, Collaboration & Cooperation, and Professional Expectations & Pursuit of Growth Opportunities
 - Transition matrix to show alignment available
 - Approval by 6/30/2026 documentation submitted by 3/1/2026

- Culturally Responsive Teaching and Learning (CRLT) Standards update:
 - New date: approved by 10/1/2025 documentation in by 6/30/2025
